Welcome to **Cosmos**, The Centre on Social Movement Studies located at the Institute of Humanities and Social Science at the Scuola Normale Superiore, Florence!

- You can **actively contribute to Cosmos events** depending on your research plans and needs. Here you can find a list of Cosmos events in which you can take part and the contact person(s) to whom you should reach out to get information on open slots:
  - **Cosmos Share:** Through the **Cosmos Share**, members of the **Cosmos** community can share their research and help each other through constructive feedback. The format is simple: one hour of informal, rigorous academic discussion, two times a month. About ten days before the meeting, presenters should send to Andrea Felicetti (the **COSMOS** Share organizer) a draft of the document they will discuss, so that he can share it with those interested in reading it and attending the session.   - **Cosmos Talks** are public discussions on cutting edge contentious politics research from across various theoretical, methodological and disciplinary traditions. They aim to provide feedback on preliminary results of current research projects, future research projects proposals and drafts of forthcoming papers, articles and book chapters. The **Cosmos Talks** also aim at improving synergies and networking



among researchers from the **Cosmos** community as well as from other universities. Scholars and researchers interested in discussing their work at one of the slots of **Cosmos Talks** should send an abstract to Lorenzo Zamponi and/or Loris Caruso (talks organizers), preferably by the end of September. A program will be then circulated. We ask presenters to send a paper (of no more than 30 pages) to the organizers, no later than a week before the scheduled talk. Each session lasts for two hours. Paper givers are given maximum 20 minutes to introduce their works. Preselected discussants are given about 10 minutes each to give constructive feedback. The floor will then be open to the public. All participants are asked to read the paper in advance.

- **Movimenti del Mondo (Movements of the World)** is a series of events promoted by the Scuola Normale Superiore and organized by Lorenzo Mosca and Donatella della Porta. The events always feature a documentary screening and a roundtable discussion about a specific contentious topic or protest dynamic. - **Cosmos RoundTables**: The **Cosmos** Roundtables bring in conversation two or three visiting scholars, from senior professors to junior PhD researchers. The COSMOS Roundtables are thought as an informal venue in which the speakers do not present their latest research, and focus instead on the exchange of ideas on current mobilizations across the world as well as on topical political moments of our times.
